

CONSULTATION REPORT

Council is upgrading the WA McInnes Reserve Playspace as part of our Let's all Play Strategy. This report outlines feedback received from the community that will help Council officers to develop a concept plan.

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Consultation period: 8 March – 11 April 2023

This engagement was an initial fact finding round to understand what the community does in the space currently and seeking ideas for improvement.

Council staff have identified the below items that could be included in the upgrade:

- Additional more inclusive play equipment
- Synthetic softfall linkages to equipment
- Sand pit equipment
- Additional and/or upgraded artwork
- Concrete pathway
- Improved garden
- Fencing improvements

What methods were implemented to notify the community of this consultation opportunity?

- Direct Notification Letters to 850 residences
- Direct emails to surrounding daycares, preschools and schools
- Email notification to 2100 Collaborate followers
- Two on-site posters one in the playspace and one along Powells Creek walkway

Consultation Outcomes Summary

Consultation Participation

23 submissions total

301 visits to the Collaborate page 14 survey submissions 9 emails

There were only a small number of submissions made, however there are some common themes emerging. There will be another opportunity to engage the community at the concept design sharing stage.

Overall Findings – email and survey

There is strong support for upgrading the space, with an opportunity to provide multi-generational amenity.

Overall, the park feels neglected and the community is excited to see upgrades that will create a more inviting and accessible place for them.


"As a resident of the community, I am excited about the prospect of having an upgraded playground in our area. I am planning to use the park at least three times a week once the upgrade is completed. Thank you for considering these suggestions. I believe that implementing these improvements would greatly benefit our community and enhance the quality of life for our children."

"While play equipment is needed, I think there is mutual benefit if facilities could also be added to facilitate social interactions for the elderly, especially with parents and young children. Social isolation is a real problem resulting in poor mental health. Having quiet spaces for yoga mats, tai chi and just circle seating with shade to encourage social chatting and picnics would also be beneficial."






18. What do you think needs the most improvement in the reserve?




17. What would you like us to prioritise in the designing of the reserve? Required




19. What play activities would you like to see included in the reserve? Required Ranking | Skipped: 1 | Answered: 11 (91.7%)






4. Why do you go to WA McInnes Reserve? Required Multi Choice | Skipped: 1 | Answered: 11 (91.7%)



5. How regularly do you use WA McInnes Reserve? Select Box | Skipped: 0 | Answered: 12 (100%)







7. How many of these children under 5 years use the reserve?




8. How many of these children over 5 years visit the reserve? Select Box | Skipped: 1 | Answered: 11 (91.7%)









12. Do you visit the playground with a person living with a disability? Required Multi Choice | Skipped: 0 | Answered: 12 (100%)




